


## **From the President**






Are you excited about participating in the Shadow Judging Project in 2023? This workshop will provide practical suggestions for enhancing your group's interaction with literature.

Whatley. A wonderful keepsake for the children.




On October 5, it was a privilege to be present at Phil Cumming's In This Place, held in the Grainger Studio and performed by the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra.

It was a wonderful event with so many families present. A fantastic introduction to the workings of an orchestra for young children and another medium to engage young readers in the wonders of books. 


